#### **Public library programs**

We understand that sometimes kids need to take a break in the middle of programming (and that's ok), while others may actually need to leave. Please know that whatever your needs may be, you're always welcome to come back and try again another time.


#### 03. A place to belong

# Services for Children of All Abilities in Libraries: An Exploration (SCALE)

The Services for Children of ALL Abilities in Libraries: An Exploration (SCALE) project is a multidimensional, multi-state, multiple site case study research project. It was designed to explore how libraries are currently serving families with young children with disabilities, in hopes of identifying positive practices that could be replicated by public libraries nationwide. The information in this pamphlet is the result of the research which included interviews and surveys with library staff and caregivers over the course of three and a half years. SCALE is a collaboration among the University of Kentucky, the University of Missouri, and Kansas's Emporia State University.



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
